

National Community Drive Development Project (NCDDP)

29th January, 2018, Yangon

Objectives

To enable poor rural communities to benefit from improved access to and use of basic infrastructure and services through a people-centered approach and to enhance the Government's capacity to respond promptly and effectively to an eligible crisis or emergency.



Timeline

- From 2012 to 2021, became effective in 2013
 - Currently in the 5th year (2017-2018) of implementation

Financing

- > Total \$545 Million
 - ➤ Government of Myanmar: (\$30m block grants + \$10m in kind)
 - > IDA Grant: \$80m
 - > IDA Credit \$400m
 - ► Government of Italy: \$22m soft loan, \$3 million debt swap grant
 - Grant contributions from DFID and Japan currently being processed.

Components

Component 1: Block grants to communities (67%)

Money for community subprojects. Held by elected village tract committees (in local bank accounts in their name, with disbursements against approved plans for subprojects)

Component 2: Facilitation and capacity building (20%)

Finance technical support at union and township levels, including community and technical facilitators and grievance redress mechanism

Component 3: Knowledge and learning (2%)

Support joint learning by government, co mmunity and civil society

Geographic Coverage

- 2016/17 coverage 47 townships, 8,500 villages home to 5.3 million people.
- In 2017/18 cycle will expand to 16 new townships, covering ca. 12165 villages home to 7 million people
- Gradual expansion to enable adaptive management:- Cycle 1 > 3 townships, Cycle 2 > 9 townships, Cycle 3 > 27 townships, Cycle 4 > 47 townships, Cycle 5> 61 townships


Townships selection process

Townships were selected through public consultation and prioritization in each state/region capital followed by endorsement of state and union government. In the absence of poverty data, GDP, education, health indicators were referenced.

Implementation Progress to date



- Ongoing implementation in 45 townships
- 16 new townships to start in this year
- Phased out in 2 townships Kyunsu Township (Thanintharyi region) and Kanpetlet Township (Chin state)
- The Project has constructed or rehabilitated over 2,500 schools, the upgrading of over 5,400 kilometers of rural roads, and the creation of over 1.6 million person days of paid labor

NCDDP - Inclusion: Gender


NCDDP includes specific provisions to ensure mainstreaming of gender and

participation of women in decision-making, including:

- At least 50 percent of committee members to be women
- Dual committee chairs (with at least one chair being a woman)
- Separate discussions among women and men prior to subproject prioritization
- Equal pay for equal work
- Gender parity among community and technical facilitators
- Project data reported disaggregated by gender





Committee Members in current 47 townships



Grievance Handing Mechanism

- Cumulative: Since July 2014, the cumulative number of grievances to end December 2017 is 12,216, of which 12,179 (99.7%) have been resolved.
- Of 589 grievances received in the fourth quarter of 2017, 19 (3%) were "core" grievances (code violation, misuse of funds etc.). Of these 15 (79%) had been resolved as of 15-01-2018.
